Venus comes into conjunction with Mars shortly after sunset on Sunday22nd February 2015. Members and friends are cordially invited to join us while we try to capture some digital images of the conjunction then do some image enhancement using the Registax software. This will be a very hands-on session, so bring a laptop if you can along with whatever observing gear you wish. We will have suitable telescopes, cameras and laptops with us as well, so we hope to be able to take you through the whole digital astrophotography process from the start, right up to putting the final result up on the GFAS website – quite a challenge!

Even if we can't observe because of the weather we will still be doing the image enhancement workshop - meet at 5:45 at Newton Stewart Golf Club, Kirroughtree Avenue, Minnigaff, Newton Stewart DG8 6PF. We have made an initial bid for funding from the Royal Astronomical Society 200 fund for a grant to let us set up a new observatory and dark sky centre, probably on a site in the Galloway Forest Park overlooking Minigaff – within the Dark Sky Park, with a very good observing outlook, but still close to town and in easy reach for locals and visitors alike. Our rough estimate is for an overall cost of £150,000 and we now have to wait and see if the RAS 200 grant committee are interested in the project. Fingers crossed, and grateful thanks to Forestry Commission Scotland for their help.
