A Rough Winter








Nov 8th 2006 Sunspot Mercury

Public event: Transit of Mercury

Mercury crosses the face of the sun on **Monday 9**th **May**. This is the third transit of Mercury this century and we hope to record the event using our solar telescopes. We also have a few sets of solar safety specs available for visitors to the event. We will be set up in the car park of the **Belted Galloway Visitor centre** on **Monday 9**th **May from 11:00am**. The transit starts at 11:12am, reaches its mid-point at 2:57pm and ends at 18:42pm. Members and visitors welcome at any time during the day. The next transit of Mercury is not until 11th November 2019.
