### Our very first movie night

We've managed to arrange a special 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary screening of the Oscarwinning blockbuster "Interstellar", a 2014 epic science fiction drama film directed by Christopher Nolan. It stars Matthew McConaughey, Anne Hathaway, Jessica Chastain, Bill Irwin, Ellen Burstyn, Matt Damon, and Michael Caine. Set in a dystopian future where Earth is suffering from catastrophic blight and famine, the film follows a group of astronauts who travel through a wormhole near Saturn in search of a new home for mankind. Theoretical physicist Kip Thorne was an executive producer and scientific consultant on the film. Thorne went on to win the Nobel prize for Physics in 2017.



### More sunspots - Hunter McCall

Here is the set up Hunter uses when either viewing sunspots or imaging them. Hunter says: For this kind of shot I would tend to use my Televue Ethos 13mm. My refractor, an Altair Astro 80mm F6, is designed for wide field astrophotography, so I've added a Televue 2.5x Powermate which in effect converts the refractor into an F15, more suitable for solar system targets. This image shows the Olympus OMD EM1 camera body taking the place of the Ethos eyepiece but with the 2.5 Powermate still in place to get a better image size.

In addition, my iPad can make a WiFi connection with Olympus camera, giving a live view of what the camera is seeing. My camera parameters can be changed on the iPad (iso and shutter speed) and the shutter release can be activated from the iPad, which eliminates vibration in the imaging rig.







### **Upcoming events**

Comet A3 (Tsuchinshan-ATLAS) is near us and there is a chance it could be visible with the naked eye, or with binoculars. The best chance to spot it will be between the 12 and 30 October if you look to the west just after sunset.
